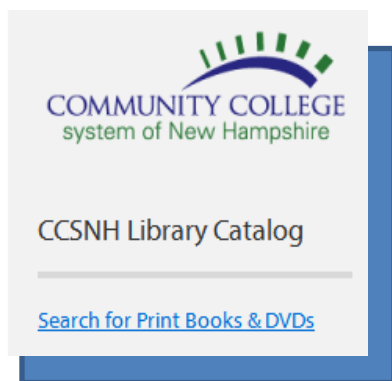
To Find Journal Articles ...

Select **Articles**

Search in our library databases—EBSCO Host, ProQuest, JSTOR and ScienceDirect—for scholarly journal articles on your research topics:

Remember to specify **full text** and **scholarly journal**. Narrow your search results by date, publication type and subject as needed.

To Find Print Books & DVDs ...

Select **Search for Print Books & DVDs** in the box on the bottom left of Library home page. Then you can search the catalog. Click on book title, then **All Copies** to see the location of a book. Place a hold for many books not at GBCC.

To Find Electronic Books ...

Select **Ebooks**

The library's major ebook collections are CREDO Reference, Ebrary, and EBSCO eBooks. ACLS, OVID and Benezit are other ebook sources.

Search for books by topic. Read them online, print out pages or chapters. Download some titles to read offline on your laptop or phone.



To Find Current Events, Videos, Maps & more ...

Select **Other Online Resources**

Points of View Reference Center, CQ Researcher have articles and reports on current events and controversial topics. Streaming video options include Films on Demand, VAST and Videatives (for early childhood education).

A-Z Maps, Global Road Warrior, Culturegrams. Market Research and A-Z World Business can also be found in this section of the Library website.
