

English Journalism B.A. Transfer Program

Community College System of New Hampshire (CCSNH) and University of New Hampshire College of Liberal Arts (UNH-COLA)

November 2, 2018

Introduction

This collaborative agreement will enable CCSNH students in **Liberal Arts, English or other related A.A. programs** to transfer seamlessly to the **English Journalism B.A. program** in the College of Liberal Arts at UNH. An agreement has been reached on how CCSNH English courses will map into current UNH-COLA program requirements. This information will allow CCSNH students to make informed course selection decisions that facilitate transfer and University access, and support Baccalaureate degree completion.

The intent of this articulation is to set forth the points of mutual understanding necessary to form, maintain and communicate transfer information between these institutions.

Grade Requirements

Students graduating with A.A. degree in English, Liberal Arts or other discipline, having completed the coursework described below with an overall GPA of 2.5 or better, will be admitted to UNH COLA and into the English Journalism B.A program under the agreement outlined here.

Students not completing a full degree program at a CCSNH college, but intending to transfer to UNH COLA and into the English Journalism B.A. program, are encouraged to take courses listed below to ensure ease of articulation with additional courses they will take once at UNH. For non-degree students, a minimum overall GPA of 2.8 will be required for transfer to the English Journalism B.A. program.

Recommended Course Planning Documents


The planning documents associated with this articulation agreement provide guidance giving CCSNH students a clear path for course selection at the CCSNH colleges that ensure maximum course transfer into the English Journalism B.A. program at UNH-COLA (see attached Appendix for details). Course planning documents will be reviewed annually to accommodate changes in program requirements and to update course equivalency agreements.

Publicizing This Agreement


After the appropriate bodies on the CCSNH and the UNH-COLA colleges have approved this agreement, this agreement will be publicized on the websites of both colleges. In addition, the New Hampshire high-school guidance departments should be informed.

Periodic Review


A formal review of this agreement by the Associate Dean and Dean of COLA and the CCSNH Vice Presidents of Academic Affairs will take place at the end of the third year following implementation of this agreement. The review will evaluate how well the students participating in this agreement are doing academically and determine whether any modifications to the existing agreement are needed to better serve student and academic program needs. Any concerns identified or opportunities to enhance the agreement will be addressed in a joint meeting of the appropriate faculty and administrators. Either UNH or CCSNH may decide to terminate the agreement with a six month notice. Individual CCSNH colleges may also decide to terminate their participation in the agreement with a six month notice. Upon termination notice, the agreement will be honored for all students who are already matriculated at a CCSNH college. In the absence of an official termination notice, this agreement should be considered in place and renewed each year.
