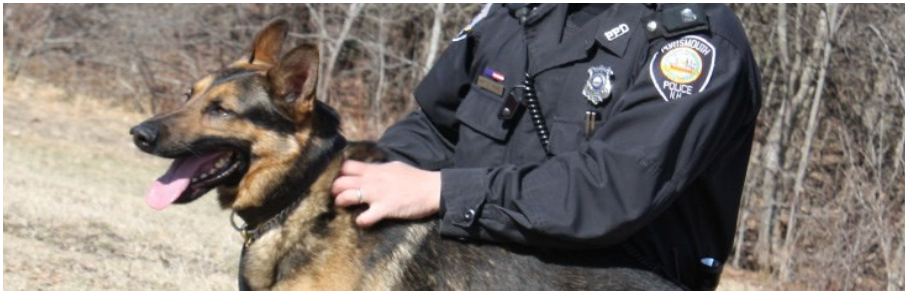
Associate in Science

The Criminal Justice degree is designed to prepare students for careers in Law Enforcement, Corrections, Juvenile Justice, or Courts. In addition, it also serves as the academic foundation to transfer on to complete a baccalaureate degree. For those already in service the program provides educational progress for promotion and other career development purposes.

ALSO OFFERED 100% ONLINE - students can enroll in the Criminal Justice program in its original format as a face to face hybrid offering, or as a 100% online program.

Guest speakers are from law enforcement, corrections, juvenile justice, and courts and are integrated into course delivery and as part of the online curriculum

After completion, students are prepared to work in local or state law enforcement as an officer, in corrections as an officer, or within the state and federal court systems.
