Great Bay's Fine Art program offers studio classes in drawing, painting, design, printmaking, and sculpture and is designed to help students develop traditional technical skills in studio art, while inspiring creative problem solving, an ability to express visual thinking in oral and written work, the ability to critique art as well as selfassess, an awareness of contemporary culture, and the exploration of personal artistic expression. With an on-campus gallery, students are exposed to the work of contemporary New England artists and provides exhibition opportunities for their own work.

The program offers students with a foundation in fine arts, designed to facilitate transfer into a four-year fine arts, studio art, art education, art history or digital art program.
