

Application for Admission

- 1. Submit completed application to Admissions or complete an online application (preferred) at www.greatbay.edu/apply/.
- Request a copy of your high school/home school transcript or HiSET/GED equivalency scores to be sent to the Admissions Office.
 Official copies are not necessary if you have a copy of your transcript in your possession, please send a copy/scan of it to gbadmissions@ccsnh.edu. Otherwise, your high school can send us one if you request it from them. Transcripts are used to potentially waive you from Accuplacer placement testing. Some programs require a high school transcript on file prior to academic advising.
- 3. If you are applying to one of the following programs of study, please complete the following:
 - Nursing: Specific admissions requirements available at https://www.greatbay.edu/program/nursing/. Application Deadline is February 28th.
 - Surgical Technology: Complete Accuplacer Testing (or be waived from testing) as part of the Admissions process.
 Application Deadline is April 1st. Specific admissions requirements available at https://www.greatbay.edu/program/surgical-technology/
 - Veterinary Technology: Complete Accuplacer Testing (or be waived from testing) as part of the Admissions process.
 Application Deadline Is April 30th. Specific admissions requirements available at https://www.greatbay.edu/program/veterinary-technology/
- 4. If you want to be considered for Financial Aid, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. You may file online at www.fafsa.gov. Our school code is **002583**.
- 5. If you have earned prior college credit, please forward an official college transcript to the Registrar's Office for transfer credit evaluation to be completed after acceptance into a program. If you wish to have an unofficial transfer credit evaluation complete prior to being accepted into a program, please complete the Unofficial Transfer Credit Evaluation Form and submit with college transcripts to the Registrar's Office. Please allow a minimum of two weeks for processing.
- 6. Veterans must submit their Certificate of Eligibility for VA Education Benefits, and any other documentation required for GBCC to certify enrollment with the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- 7. Plan to take the Accuplacer placement test through the Center for Academic Planning and Support (CAPS) if you are not waived. Placement testing can be scheduled by calling 603-427-7715 or emailing greatbaycaps@ccsnh.edu.
- 8. Attend an Advising appointment to pick your course schedule and submit your completed registration form at our One Stop.
- 9. Attend New Student Orientation (date and time will be mailed) and begin classes! Familiarize yourself with Great Bay Community College by visiting our website at www.greatbay.edu
- 10. International Applicants are required to submit a non-refundable \$100 International Student Admissions Fee in addition to the application. All application materials must be received at least 30 days prior to the start of the applied term.
